- ii. In response, Ld. Counsel of the Petitioner also agreed that one months' time may be allowed to the Petitioner to file its compliance report. He also sought some time to submit his response on the MPPMCL's aforementioned report.

Considering the above, four weeks' time is granted to the Respondent No.1 to submit their compliance report to the Commission and simultaneously serve a copy of the same to the Petitioner and other Respondents. The Petitioner and the other Respondents are granted liberty to submit their response, if any within one week thereafter.
3. As requested by the Petitioner, Interim Relief granted vide daily order dated 20/02/2026 shall continue till next date of hearing in this petition.
4. The case is fixed for argument on the **11th August 2026**.
