Shri Saurabh Mishra, Advocate appeared on behalf of the petitioners.

Petitioners have filed the subject petition under clause 11.23 read with clause 11.19 of the Madhya Pradesh Electricity Supply Code 2021 seeking regulatory dispensation for executing the agreements required under Supply Code, 2021 through online mode and uploading self-certified test reports.

2. At the motion hearing, petitioners reiterated the genesis of the petition. Commission observed that the petitioner has not mentioned any provisions of Indian Stamp Act 1899 (as amended) as adopted in MP with regard to execution/validity of agreement and their admissibility as evidence. Commission further observed that the requirement of submission of test report in case of new / additional load sanction is specified under the Central Electricity Authority (Measures relating to Safety and Electric Supply) Regulations, 2023. Petitioner has not cited relevant provisions of CEA Regulations and state government notifications issued thereunder.

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3. Commission held that the petition in the present form is not admissible. Commission directed that the petitioner may file a revised petition in light of all the relevant regulatory and statutory provisions. Commission also directed the Secretary of the Commission to adjust the petition fee paid in this case against fee payable for the revised petition, if any filed by the petitioners subsequently.
4. With the aforesaid directions, instant petition stands disposed of.
