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2. During hearing, the petitioner broadly reiterated the contents of its Petition and Rejoinder dated 24/03/2025. The Respondent No. 1 broadly reiterated the contents of its Reply dated 28/02/2025 and confirmed that it has no objection with regard to maintainability of the petition. The Respondent No. 2 stated that it adopts the Reply of Respondent No. 1 as submitted vide its letter dated 24/03/2025. The parties sought time to submit responses on Merits of the Petition. The Petitioner prayed that Interim Relief granted on 17/12/2024 and continued on 28/01/2025 may kindly be continued till disposal of the petition.

The Commission considered their aforementioned submissions and directed that Interim Relief granted vide daily order dated 17/12/2024 and continued on 28/01/2025 shall further continue till next date of hearing. The Commission directed to the Petitioner and the Respondents to submit their responses on the Merits of the subject Petition within two weeks i.e. latest by 09/04/2025. Copies of the same be served simultaneously to all other parties to the Petition. Parties are at liberty to file their rejoinders to such response latest by 16/04/2025 with copies to all other parties to the petition simultaneously.
4. The case is fixed for final hearing on the **23<sup>rd</sup> April 2025**.
