Shri N. K. Sharma, AGM, Shri G. L.Pandey, DGM and Shri Aditya Vijay Singh, Advocate, appeared on behalf of the petitioner.

2. The petitioner has filed the instant petition under section 86(1) (e), 61(h) and 62 of the Electricity Act, 2003 for review of rate for procurement of inadvertent flow of electricity from solar projects, wherein the petitioner has prayed as under:

- i. Admit this petition on record and treat it as complete;
- ii. Review the applicability of APPC rate in solar tariff order dated 01.08.2012 and 08.08.2016, towards inadvertent flow of energy into the grid from solar projects and prescribe rate for inadvertent flow should be in line with as in case of Wind Tariff order dated 17.03.2016.
- iii. Consider revised rate as Rs. 1.00 (one)/kWH and shall be applicable on existing as well as future PPWAs from the date of notification of order of Hon'ble Commission in this petition or from such date as Hon'ble Commission may fix.
- iv. Condone any inadvertent omissions/ errors/ shortcomings and permit to add/ change/ modify/ alter this filing and make further submissions as may be required at a future date;
- v. Pass such order, as the Hon'ble Commission may deem fit and appropriate keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the case

3. The case was listed for motion hearing on 08th January' 2019. During the hearing the petitioner restated the content of the petition.

4. The Commission observed that the petitioner is seeking the review of the Commission's Order dated 01.08.2012 for which control period has already been expired long back. Also, the control periods of the Tariff Orders dated 08.08.2016 and 17.03.2016 are going to end by March 2019. Moreover, any change in the Tariff Orders would be applicable from the prospective date.

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5. The Commission has opined that the instant petition has not been appropriately taken up by the petitioner. The new control period will commence from 01st April 2019, hence, it would be appropriate to consider such prayer for the ensuing control period only. The petitioner may submit the suggestions, if any, for the tariff to be determined for the next control period, when the process for the same is initiated.

6. With the aforesaid directions, the petition no. 56/2018 stands disposed of.

Ordered accordingly.
