None appeared on behalf of the Petitioner.

2. The Petitioner has filed this petition under Clause 3.4 of MP Electricity Supply Code, 2004 and Clause 1.18 of General Terms and Conditions of High Tension Tariff.

3. The Petitioner has availed a power connection of 36 MW at 132 KV from Respondent No.2 (East Discom). The Petitioner requested the East Discom to permanently disconnect supply after its two captive power plants of 25 MW and 38.5 MW at the JRP became fully operational. The East Discom refused to grant the permission for the same. The Petitioner however stopped availing supply after the notice period was over. The Petitioner had filed a Petition before the Hon'ble Supreme Court in respect of arrears and permanent disconnection. The Petitioner has further submitted that the Hon'ble Supreme Court has grant stay against recovery of arrears pending disposal of the case. The Petitioner has submitted that the aforesaid two captive power plant at JRP have developed problem in the turbine simultaneously. The Petitioner has further stated that after the shut-down of captive power

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plants, it has availed 9.53 MW power from its other plants having captive power through open access and 3.07 MW from Indian Energy Exchange. The Petitioner is willing to avail additional power of 25 MW from IEX/wheeling from sister units/East Discom. State Load Despatch Centre has refused to grant permission for the purchase of power as the power above 50 MVA cannot be transmitted at 132 KV under the provisions of MP Electricity Supply Code, 2004.

4. The Petitioner has submitted that even though the additional power will make the notional power to be transmitted as 75 MW, such additional power can be allowed to be supplied at 132 KV with the approval of the Commission as per Clause 1.18 of General Terms and Conditions of Tariff order for HT consumers. As per Clause 1.19 of Other Terms and Conditions of Tariff order 2010-11, deviation in respect of above minimum/maximum contract demand on account of technical reasons may be permitted after obtaining specific approval of the Commission by the consumer. The Petitioner has prayed to allow 25 MVA power over and above 50 MVA to flow on Jaypee Rewa Plant feeder at 132 KV for two months.

5. The case was listed for motion hearing on 04.01.2011.

6. The Petitioner vide letter dated 03.01.2011 requested to allow withdrawal of the above petition without specifying any reason. The Commission hereby permits the Petitioner to withdraw the petition.

7. Accordingly, the Petition No. 88/2010 stands disposed of.
