The Petitioner, Bhopal Municipal Corporation (BMC) has filed this petition seeking amendment in clause 10.1 (ii) & (iii) of MPERC (Cogeneration and Generation of Electricity from Renewable Sources of Energy) Regulations, 2021 (Revision-II) {RG-33 (II) of 2021} for “Accounting of Banked Energy and return of banked energy”.

Heard the petitioner on the prayer for amendment in clause 10.1 (ii) & (iii) of MPERC (Cogeneration and Generation of Electricity from Renewable Sources of Energy) Regulations, 2021 (Revision-II) {RG-33 (II) of 2021}. It is also noted that Ministry of Power, Government of India has notified Electricity (Promoting Renewable Energy Through Green Energy Open Access) Rules, 2022 on June 6, 2022 which will require amendment to MPERC (Cogeneration and Generation of Electricity from Renewable Sources of Energy) Regulations, 2021 (Revision-II) {RG-33 (II) of 2021} in order to align with the provision under aforesaid Rules. Therefore, considering that the process of amending these Regulations shall have to be taken up by the Commission, the request of petitioner can also be considered alongwith other amendments as may be necessary. As such, the subject petition may not be heard further and stands disposed of.
