In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 181 (g) read with Section 32(3) of the Electricity Act, 2003, the Madhya Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission hereby makes the following amendments to the Regulations Madhya Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission (Levy and Collection of Fee and Charges by State Load Despatch Centre) Regulations, 2004, (Revision 1, 2006) (RG - 16 of 2006) notified vide No. 1192/MPERC/2006 dated 5th May 2006.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO MADHYA PRADESH ELECTRICITY REGULATORY COMMISSION (LEVY AND COLLECTION OF FEE AND CHARGES BY STATE LOAD DESPATCH CENTRE) REGULATIONS, 2004, (REVISION 1, 2006) (RG - 16 OF 2006)

_1. Short Title and Commencement

- (i) These Regulations may be called the "Madhya Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission (Levy and Collection of Fee and charges by State Load Despatch Centre) Regulations, 2004, (Revision 1, 2006) (First Amendment) (A[RG- 16] (i) of 2006)".
- (ii) These Regulations shall come into force with effect from the date of its publication in the official gazette.
- (iii) These Regulations shall extend to the entire State of Madhya Pradesh.

2. Addendum to clause 2.4:

In the Madhya Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission (Levy and Collection of Fee and charges by State Load Despatch Centre) Regulations, 2004, (Revision 1, 2006) hereinafter called the Principle Regulations, after the clause 2.4 the following clause 2.4 (a) shall be inserted, namely:

"2.4 (a) "Non-conventional Energy Sources" means energy from Sun (Thermal and Photovoltaic),
Biomass (Direct burning, Gasification or Methanation, including Municipal Solid Waste), Wind,
Small Hydel power plants up to 25 MW station capacity and Co-generation, etc."

3. Addendum after clause 8.6:

In the Principle Regulations after the clause 8.6 the following clause 8.7 shall be added, namely:

*8.7 All Non-conventional Energy Generators shall be required to pay one time Connection-fee of Rs. 5000.00 only irrespective of the type of agreement whether Long-term or Short-term."
